TLNA Survey for Proposed Washington Development

Introduction

Willow Partners has met with the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Association to discuss a proposed development on the 700 block of East Washington, where the current QTI building, and post office annex are. The proposal is 14 stories, and includes commercial, retail, and community space. There are a mix of studios, 1, 2, and 3 bedroom apartments, and 263 parking spaces for both residents and the commercial space tenants. The developer has set a goal of having 5 units affordable at 80% AMI.

Process

The proposal is currently in Urban Design District (UDD) 8, which limits the height of the building to eight stories, plus two additional bonus stories. The developer is seeking to amend the district to allow up to 14 stories, which is the maximum height possible at this site due to FAA height limits. Alder Rummel and TLNA are requesting feedback on what should amenities the developer should provide in exchange for amending the UDD. Changing the UDD will require approval from both the Urban Design Commission and the Common Council.

The purpose of this survey is to collect feedback related to amending UDD 8 to allow for increased height. The proposal may change if the amendment passes, and there may be a second survey.

The developer's first informational informational presentation at Urban Design Commission (UDC) on August 16. There will be a subsequent meeting at Urban Design to vote on amending the UDD, and if UDC approves the amendment, it will go to Plan Commission after that.


